Writing Melodic Etudes

- 1. Choose a key
- 2. Pick 4 chords in that key (see "harmonized scale chart")
- 3. Play the scale of that key (see "open position major scales")
- 4. write out chord tones of each chord
- 5. decide one chord tone to land on for the first beat of each chord
- 6. connect these notes with other notes from the scale

(more advanced steps – choose any one or more of the following)

- use an 8 bar chord progression instead of 4
- use rests
- use common tones from chord to chord whenever possible
- vary steps, skips, and leaps
- use octave displacement
- balance arpeggios (chord tones) with scalar movement
- use chromatic notes
- use delayed resolution (begin on non-chord tone then resolve, ex: 6 to 5 or 4 to 3)
- tie sus4 from a previous chord tone
